The Junior Master Gardener program engages children in "hands-on" group and individual learning experiences that instill a love of gardening, develop an appreciation for the environment, and cultivate the mind.

The JMG Program includes:

- Independent and group learning experiences
 - Life/skill and career exploration
 - Service learning opportunities for youth
- Correlation to NYS Learning Standards (all areas, not just Science)

The Jr. Master Gardener Program is open to any child in grades 3-9, and children can begin at any level:

Level I: Grades 3-5

Level II: Grades 6-9

Children will learn about Botany, Plant Identification, Soil and Water Conservation, Garden & Landscape Design and Maintenance, Insect & Plant Problems. Students use what they have learned to be of service to others, such as community beautification projects.
